| Outline your motion in no more than 200 words | Councils are losing out on skills. |
| | Nationally a third of councillors are women, less in the Independent Group, with only 23pc, overall. Within our group, women range from the Green Party members at 35% to around 25% in our other political groups. Only 17pc of Council leaders are women, though women and men are equally likely to want to progress to a more senior role. 43pc say they are held back by assumptions about their gender. Research by the Fawcett Society and the LGiU just published demonstrates there is more to do. |

| | 1. The Independent Group Executive gives consideration to join the Fawcett and the Women in Local Government Societies and takes a full and active role in activities |

| | leading up to the centenary of the first vote for women. 2. Drawing on the success of some of our political groups, I also propose that a strategy be drawn up for our Independent group as part of the "Be a Councillor" campaign to recruit good candidates who are women from all groups and encourage all our members to take part. 3. Some organisations have set the target of reaching 50:50 by 2020. I propose we set the same target. Our group is the most politically diverse. Let us also work to shine as one of the most equitable. |
